SUBJECT: COVID OUTBREAK MEMO
DATE: April 4, 2022

We remain in outbreak status. The last new case was March 28.

If we continue with no new cases, we will be over the outbreak on April 7. Fingers crossed!

1st floor: Community Care:

Precious Blood, Orchard View: No active cases.

- Residents are not on isolation, but restrictions in place:
- Wear a mask when outside of your room.
- Leave your room for:
 - Dining
 - Physical activity (a walk indoors or outdoors)
 - Getting a snack from the kitchenette (return to your room).
- Dining is in the dining room but will be distanced from others.
- No congregate activities or get togethers.
- Residents can leave their room with a mask on, can go for a walk indoors.
- Remain at 1 PIC.
- Can go outdoors for a walk on the property (mask not required outdoors).
- Can go out with the 1 PIC for a drive or to just the 1 PIC's home.

- Sherwood Forest: 1 active case.
 - Residents to remain in their rooms.
 - Meals are served to rooms.
 - All other tests have been negative.
 - Remain at 1 PIC.
 - Resident can walk in the hallway in their neighborhood with a mask on.

2nd floor: Nursing Care:

- Carriage House: No active cases.
 - Residents must remain in Carriage House.
 - Remain at 1 PIC.
 - Residents may leave the neighborhood if going for a drive or outside for a walk with the PIC. The resident should take extra precautions of hand hygiene and masking and should not interact with residents from other areas.
 - PICs now travel through Hilltop on the second floor.
- Hilltop View & St. Dunstan's Way: No active cases.
 - Residents may come out of their rooms but stay in the neighborhood.
 - Communal dining will resume in the neighborhood dining rooms.
 - Remain at 1 PIC.
 - Residents must stay on the neighborhood.
 - Residents may leave the neighborhood if going for a walk outside. The resident should take extra precautions of hand hygiene and masking and should not interact with residents from other areas.

Partners in Care can swap out to a different partner-in-care. If you feel your loved one needs an additional PIC or the main PIC is unavailable, please contact us about a second PIC. A second PIC can be considered.

PICs can pick up test kits (3 tests inside) to take home. Do a rapid antigen test before you come to visit. You do not need to show proof of the negative test.

We hope this is the home stretch!
